LOCATING ELECTRONIC JOURNAL ARTICLES: USING THE FIND IT@WMU BUTTON

Over the past few years academic journals have been making great progress in placing the full text of articles (electronic journals) online. Frequently when users find articles they need for research they are unsure whether the article is available in print at the library, or online as a full-text electronic Journal article.

LOCATING A SPECIFIC CITATION

When searching a database search results include a specific citation to a document or article. In most cases the search result will include a button called *FIND IT AT WMU*. The FIND IT @WMU button will provide information about sources for the article, including print options in the library and any available online electronic articles.

Note the citation is repeated at the top, and several options are shown for full text electronic access to the article. In addition local WMU library information is provided about the Journal within the library collection.
